1. **Henry (Jr.) WATKINS** was born 1660 in Henrico County, VA. He died 1714/1715 in Henrico County, VA.

Henry Watkins, Jr., born 1660 (will 1714), mentions wife, Mary; Sons: John, Benjamin, Joseph and Stephen (will of Stephen Watkins in Amelia Records, April, 1754).

Witnesses: Robert Woodson, Jr., Thomas Edwards and Allen Tye. - (Henrico Records.)

* HENRY WATKINS, son of Henry... Henry Watkins who died in Henrico County in 1714 was the son of Henry born about 1638. His will named wife MARY, sons John, Benjamin, Joseph, Henry and Stephen. His sons were all under age in 1714. His son STEPHEN died in 1758 in Chesterfield County. Stephen left a will which named his children. They lived in Chesterfield and Powhatan Counties. Stephen's son BENJAMIN was a minister in Powhatan. Stephen's widow, JUDITH, married Mr. Dupuy and Judith Dupuy's will proved in Powhatan County in 1809 named many of her grandchildren. BENJAMIN WATKINS, son of Stephen also left a will in Powhatan County which gives information about his family. Benjamin Watkins, son of Henry who died in 1714, married his cousin JANE WATKINS, daughter of Thomas Watkins of Swift Creek. Benjamin's will was proved in Goochland County in 1753 and Jane's was proved in 1778. Other Watkins wills recorded in Goochland County give information on the children and grandchildren of Benjamin and Jane Watkins.

1699: "An account of society members contributing to building of Curles Meeting House following the meeting of 9/12/1699: Jane Pleasants, James Howard, HENRY WATKINS SR., Edward Huggs (Hughes?) William Porter, Jr., John Crew, John Robinson, Ephraim Gartrite, William Lead, Robert Boyes, Samuel Gartrite, John Pleasants, Nicholas Hutchins, Edward Mosby, Joseph Pleasants, HENRY WATKINS JR., Benjamin Woodson, John Woodson."

September 8, 1701: "Nicholas HUTCHINS and MARY WATKINS both of Henrico County married 9th day, 8th month, 1701. Hitnesses: HENRY WATKINS, JR., James Howard, Edward Massey, Robert Cate, Wm. Lead, Ephr. Gartrite, Samuel Gartrite, John Pleasants, Robert Boyes, Wm. Porter, Jr., Tarlton Woodson, Benjamin Woodson, Edward Goode, Jr., Joseph Woodson, Jr., Robert Crew, Joseph Pleasants, Mary Howard, MARY WATKINS, Elizabeth Crispe, Sarah Crispe, Jane Pleasants, Huldah Lead, Judith Woodson, Martha Pleasants, ___nry Woodson."

August 17, 1703, Robert Crew and Sarah Crispe (daughter of Mary Howard) married. Witnesses were Edward Thomas, John Crew, James Howard, HENRY WATKINS, Joseph Parson, Wm. Lead, Thosmas Gregory, HENRY WATKINS, JR., Nathaniel Jordan, Joseph Pleasants, Mary Howard, Sarah Rinshall, Eliza. Crispe, Huldah Lead, Sarah Rinchal Jr., Jane Pleasants and Joana Jarret (and others),

April 17, 1719. "John Hughes appointed clerk. After Tarlton Woodson and Judith Fleming proposed their marriage to the meeting, the meeting discussed whether marriages to first cousins were agreeable according to scripture. John Pleasants, Joseph Pleasants, Joseph Woodson, Jr., William Porter, Jr., John Crew, HENRY WATKINS, JR., Nick? Hutchins, William Lead voted against it; and G. R. Ellyson, Robert Hughes, Robert Woodson, Benjamin Woodson, Richard Feris, Edward Mosby, Charles Fleming, John Woodson and John Atkinson were for it."

Margaret Porter and Frances Gathright were appointed to visit MARY and inquire into her clearness (marriage intent of Edward Mosby & Mary Watkins) 8 mo (August) 1716. (Meetings near Black Creek - White Oak Swamp Meeting House was not in use until summer of 1723)

Quaker. Nicholas was chosen as overseer for Curles Meeting of Friends, Henrico, later of White Oak Swamp meeting, which met in his home.1

Note Received Land Grant on the James River. In the Patent Book #9, p. 436, is noted as being "along ye north bank of James River and on ye west side of ye Four Mile Creek" - - about three miles below Dutch Gap, in the vicinity of Farrar Island.1

Marriage* 11 October 1742 Hanover Co., VA, Date in Hinshaw's is 1743/4,11,14 and Oct.11, 1743

"Whereas John Stanley and Marthy Hutchings of Hanover County in Virginia having published their intentions of taking each other in marriage before two monthly meetings of the people called Quakers according to the good order used amongst them whose proceedings therein after a deliberate consideration thereof with regard to the righteous law of God and the example of his people recorded in the Scriptures of Truth as in that case was approved by the said meeting they appearing clear of all others and having consent of parente and friends concerned. Now these are to certify all whome it may concern that for the full accomplishing their said intention this eleventh day ye tenth month 1743 the said John Stanley and Marthy Hutchings by the hand did openly declare as followeth. You are my witnesses that I doe this day take this my friend Marthy Hutchings to be my wife promissing with the Lords assistance to be to her a faithful and loving husband till death and then the said Marthy Hutchings did in like manner declare as followeth. You are my wittnesses that I doe this day take this my friend John Stanley to be my husband promissing with the Lords assistance to be to him a faithful and loving wife till death; and the said John Stanley and Marthy Hutchings as a further confirmation thereof did then and there to these present sett their hands and we whose names are hereunto subscribed being present at the sollomnization of their said marriage and subscription above as witnesses have hereunto sett our hands the day and year above written. John Stanley Marthy Stanley" Witnesses: William Stanley, Strangeman Hutchings, Thomas Stanley, Ashley Johnson, Daniel Paine, William Paine, Joseph Harris, Thomas Glass, James Stanley, Benjamin Wadkins, Jane Hutchings, Mary Harris, John Sandors, Charley Johnson, Mary Harris Jr. Elizabeth Stanley, Madox Stanley, Principal=John Stanley.

3. **John (son of Henry) WATKINS ("the tray-maker")** (Henry (Jr.)) was born about 1695 in Henrico County, VA. He died about 1743/1744 in Henrico County, VA.

JOHN WATKINS, "The Traymaker", b. 1683/4, m. Elizabeth --- Constance's father was called "John, the Traymaker". John Watkins' family made trays for several generations and only John seems to have retained the title for posterity. Died 1744.

"Quaker Records of Henrico Monthly Meeting" by F. Edward Wright, pages 1 - 11

January 5, 1720: Those mentioned to attend the marriage of John Watkins and Sarah Nutler/Butler's marriage were Andrew Crew, Nannah Elyson, Robert Hunnicut and John Beuford.

"John Watkins born ca 1695, Henrico Co., VA, married Apr 1720, Sarah Butler. John died post 1736."

(Note: this was most probably John's first marriage, and Sarah died.)

"Quaker Records of Henrico Monthly Meeting" by F. Edward Wright, pages 1 - 11

November 7, 1720: "A debate between John Watkins and Edward Mosby concerning John Watkins unjustly taking cider from Mosby was settled when John Watkins acknowledged fault and Edward Mosby forgave him."

Mazy, 1722: John Watkins is among those contributing to building the monthly meeting house. Others were Benjamin Watkins, Robert Elyson, Joseph and Thomas Pleasants; Wm Lead, Benjamin Johnson; Robert Crew, Thomas Standley, Jr.; Joseph Woodson, and other.

LANDS AND DEEDS:

Henry Watkins, planter, was dead before 1737, in which year his son, John Watkins, made a deed to John Pleasants, of "that tract of land in county aforesaid, called Malborn Hills (sic), being the plantation whereon Henry Watkins, the grandfather of John Watkins, and also Henry Watkins, the father of John Watkins, dwelt the last part of their lives," 100 acres. John Watkins made another deed in 1737, "as eldest son and heir of Henry Watkins, planter," to Gov. James Cocke of lands on Chickahominy, "which he had as heir of his grandfather, Henry Watkins, and joining Edward Watkins' land."

"Henrico County, Virginia Deeds, 1706-1737":

Pg 671 11 October 1737. JOHN WATKINS, son of Henry Watkins, late of Henrico County, planter, to John Pleasants of same, merchant, for 40 (pounds) land at Malborn Hills, adjoining where Stephen Woodson now lives, being land where Henry father of said John, and Henry Watkins grandfather of said John, dwelt the last part of their lives, 100 acres. Recorded 1st Mon. Dec. 1737.

Pg 675 11 October 1737. JOHN WATKINS, eldest son and heir of Henry Watkins, late of Henrico County, planter, to James Cocke of same, for 5 (pounds), land on Chickahominy Swamp that said Watkins might have as heir at law of his grandfather Henry Watkins, adjoining said James Cocke and land of Edward Watkins. Wit: John Pleasants, James Hatcher, William Hatcher, Edward Bennet; recorded 1st Mon. Dec. 1737

John Watkins was proccessioner of lands next to Chickahominy swamp 1739, with Nathaniel Bacon and Peter Patrick. - (Henrico Records.)

Will of John Watkins, Henrico county (23d July, 1743, p. 9th May, 1744), mentions sons: David, Josiah, John and Nathaniel (lands in Goochland, now Cumberland); daughters: Lucy Perkins and Constance Woodson - (Henrico Records). Per "Colonial Wills of Henrico County, 1654-1781" his will read as follows:

WILL OF JOHN WATKINS, July 28, 1743:

To son David, 1 shilling

To son Isiah, 1 shilling

To daughter Lucy Perkins, 1 shilling

To daughter Constant Woodson, 1 shilling

To son John, 100 acres I purchased of Richard Parker, whereon I now live and 50 acres joining it, and my carpenter and coopers tools and the mare I bought of William Drew and saddle I had of Dannit Abney.

To son Nathaniel, 400 acres on Green Creek, adjoining Squire's Randolph line in Goochland County.

To daughter Elizabeth Watkins, bed I lie on.

To daughter Joyce Watkins, 1 feather bed

To wife Elizabeth, a negro

Wife and son John to be executors; Witnessed by Henry Stokes, Ann Stokes, Honour Sullivant, Recorded May 1744.

"P 256: Will of John Watkins presented by Elizabeth Watkins, the executrix, and proved by witnesses Henry Stokes and Edward Good, security John Watkins; John Williamson, Nathaniel Bacon and Henry Stokes to appraise.

In the October Court of 1744, page 285, the inventory of John Watkins, deceased, was recorded.

John married **Elizabeth BUTLER** on 1720.

"Kegley's Virginia Frontier: "Contemporary Frontier Settlements 1740-1760"

"Settlements Along James River and the Staunton Below the Mountains: While the settlements on the branches of James River and the Roanoke above the mountains were being made the adjacent territory below the mountains was being occupied by advancing Virginians. Col. John Bolling's great tract of 20,000 acres was one of the first grants near the mountains. Nicholas Davies came next about him on the James with a large grant that extended to the mountains. Charles Lunch patented two tracts on the north side of Staunton River and one of the south side. Benjamin Clements had a small grant (1742) on the south side of Staunton. James Daniel and John Phelps were large land holders with neighbors in John Harvey, OBADIAH WOODSON, and Matthew Talbot. About this time (1744) Louisa was cut off from Hanover and Albemarle from Goochland. The line between Albemarle and Goochland ran from the point of the fork of James River in the northeast course to Louisa County line, and from the said point of the Fork in a direct course to Brook's Mill, and thence the same course continued to Appomattox River. A special bill requiring the surveyors of the new counties of Albemarle and Augusta to reside in their respective counties

whereof they were surveyors was passed in October, 1744. The town of Richmond was now established by law, 1742, and fairs were allowed to be held there."

Wit: John Cooper, Edward Mathews, Tarlton Woodson; Recorded 5 October 1724.

Benj. Watkins Will . Goochland county (27th September, 1752 , p. 18th September, 1753), wife, Jane (who was daughter of Thomas Watkins, of "Swift's Creek," Cumberland county, who d. 1760), mentions sons: Joseph, Benj. and Thomas. Daughters: Elizabeth, Mary, Lida, Jane, Edith and Susannah.

Benjamin Watkins (3.Henry3, 2.HENRY2, 1.Henry1) born ca 1698, Henrico Co., VA, (son of Henry Watkins and Mary Crewes? Crisp?) occupation farmer, married 1726, in ?Henrico Co., VA, Jane Watkins, born 1708, Henrico Co., VA, (daughter of Thomas Watkins and Elizabeth Pride) died 2 Dec 1777, Goochland Co., Va, Married Benjamin Watkins(ca 1698-1753). Benjamin died 17 Sep 1753, Goochland Co., Va. Benjamin Watkins will made 17 Sep 1752; lived at north central Powhatan co., VA (Genito Creek) in 1722; Quaker who rejoined the Cedar Creek group.

Benjamin married **Jean/Jane WATKINS**, daughter of THOMAS "of Swift Creek" WATKINS * and Elizabeth PRIDE *, on 1726 in Henrico County, VA. Jean/Jane was born 1708 in Henrico County, VA. She died 2 Dec 1777 in Goochland County, VA.

Mrs. Jane Watkins ' Will. Goochland (31st October, 1777 , p. March 16, 1778), mentions: Sons: Joseph , Thomas and Benj. Daughters: Mary Johnson , Judith Johnson , Lydia Johnson , Edith Riddle , Jane Matthews and Susannah Gray.

Jane (Jaen) Watkins was born in 1708 in Henrico, Virginia. She died on 2 Dec 1777 in Goochland, Virginia. She was sealed to her parents on 5 Dec 1799 in the Salt Lake temple. She was baptized on 17 Aug 1799 in the Salt Lake temple. She was endowed on 20 Sep 1799 in the Salt Lake temple. She married Benjamin Watkins in 1726 in , Henrico, Virginia. They were sealed on 5 Oct 1948 in the Manti Utah temple.

Jean received the following in her father Thomas Watkins' will (1760)
