# Sen. Francis WATKINS of Poplar Hill & Falkland and his Descendants

#### First Generation

1. **Sen. Francis WATKINS "of Poplar Hill & Falkland** "Frank" was born 15 Jul 1745 in Henrico County, VA. He died 1826 in "Poplar Hill" Prince Edward County, VA.

"II. FRANCIS WATKINS, of Poplar Hill, was the second son of Thomas of Chickahominy. At an early age he received in the office of his uncle, Benjamin WATKINS, the celebrated first clerk of Chesterfield. His limited education was obtained under his uncle's training, and his subsequent practical and useful life demonstrated the benefits he derived from these early associations. He ever felt very grateful to his uncle for his kindness. He became a deputy sheriff of Chesterfield county; and entered his life of business with a single "pistareen" as his fortune. The first money he ever earned he appropriated to the purchase of Rollins Ancient History; and although uneducated in the learning of the schools he did not allow his mind to be uncultivated, but exhibited the industry which he carried into other pursuits, in acquiring useful and practical knowledge. About 1767 he came to Prince Edward and qualified during the year as deputy to Mr. J. LeNeve, the first clerk of Prince Edward. In 1783 (at Mr. Le Neve's death) he was elected the clerk of the county court, as also those of the clerk of the District and Circuit courts, he held till the year 1825, a period of forty-two years. He resigned his offices during this year and died in 1826.

"He married Agnes, daughter of Richard WOODSON and of Nannie, his former wife, formerly Nannie MICHENUX, a French woman of Huguenot celebrity. A faithful sketch of the life and character of Mrs. Agnes Watkins might be profitable and interesting, especially to her descendants. She was a remarkable woman in many respects, and of undoubted genius. This narrative could be extended far beyond the limits I propose to myself, with authentic anecdotes, told by the old people of this day, of the great ingenuity of Mrs. Watkins, as displayed in her original calico prints (in advance of her age), of her silk manufactures, of the loom made by her directions, and of her home made gamut (?) for teaching her daughters the elementary principles of music. She too was as firm and daring in action as she was bold and original in thought. A deserter from General Tarlton's forces at Moore's Ordinary, in the uniform and supposed by her to be a British soldier, attempted to frighten her on one occasion; he soon found, that by flight alone he could escape the fire of her rifle, in the use of which she was practiced and skillful. She died about 1820.

"Francis Watkins and wife lived for the whole of their long and happy married life at Poplar Hill, the present residence of their grandson, Francis P. Wood.

"Of the character of Francis Watkins I have naturally heard more than of his brothers and sisters. He seems to have been held in high esteem for his sound judgment, great integrity, industry and benevolence, by all who knew him. The judges and lawyers (some of eminence), who attended the session of the District Court at Prince Edward C(ourt) H(ouse) were his friends and frequent guests, and Colonel Patrick HENRY particularly seems to have been on terms of intimacy with him and his correspondent. The Hon. George M. BIBB, (a native of Prince Edward and a U. S. Senator from Kentucky) says of him "that he was most punctilious in the discharge of the duties of his office, an experienced clerk. Of great intelligence, of comprehensive mind, and by long experience and observation had become well versed in the general principles of law and equity, without having been a regular student of the law. His habits of business, his great integrity and uprightness, and the scrupulous performance of his duties in all relations of life, had gained for him the respect and confidence of the judges, the lawyers, and the community."

I, David Flournoy, being in lowe and weake condition do make and ordain this my last will and testament. In the name of God, Amen.

First, I desire that all my just debts may be paid by me executors hereafter named; then I give my brother, Mathews Flournoy five hundred acres of land, lying and being in the county of Prince Edward joining Jno. Martin, Abraham Baker, and Charles Anderson, to him and his heirs forever. I likewise give to the said Matthews two hundred acres of land in Chesterfield to him and to his heirs forever. I likewise give the sd. Matthews Flournoy all the profit of my sheriff's office if any due, and fifty pounds to be raised out of my estate as soone as possible by making crops to him and to his heirs forever.

Then I give my brother, Thomas Flournoy, my plantation whereon I now live

with six hundred and eighty acres land joining thereto to him and to his heirs forever. I likewise give the said Thomas Flournoy five negroes (viz) Will, Suckye, Patience, Lucy, and Frank, to him and to his heirs forever. I also give the sd. Thomas my stock of all kind together with my household furniture and wearing appearel to him and to his heirs forever. Then I give to my sister, Mary Booker, one small negro girl named Molly and her futur increase to her and to her heirs forever.

And lastly, I do appoint Thomas Scott my hole and sole executor to this my last will and testament.

In witness, I have set my hand and seal this 7th day Sept. 1757.

"Falkland" One of the earliest remaining houses in Prince Edward County, Falkland was built in the late quarter of the 18th century for Francis Watkins, Sr., a long-time county clerk and trustee of Hampden-Sydney College. The four bay, hall parlor dwelling is a little altered vernacular house of a type found thought the upper South from the Virginia Piedmont westward. Falkland is an unusually large example, with generous scale and original one story wings of unequal lengths. Francis Watkins, Jr., who inherited Falkland, was himself a county magistrate and captain of the local militia. Upon his move to Alabama in 1820, Watkins sold Falkland to his brother-in-law James Woods, a tobacco manufacturer who also was a Hampden-Sydney trustee.

Misc notes: Regarding a Francis Watkins: (about 1803) "Henry Clay also exerted influence beyond his own blood kin. For example, Claiborne and Territorial Secretary Boling Robertson invoked Clay's name in recommending a relative named Francis Watkins for appointment as a midshipman aboard the naval vessels in New Orleans. They wrote to David Porter that the seventeen year old "possesses a good moral character, and (as we learn) has received the advantage of a liberal education."

"Joseph Venable, born June 28, 1761, in Charlotte county, Virginia, was married January, 1791, to Elizabeth Watkins, daughter of Francis Watkins and Agnes Woodson of Poplar Hill.

Joseph Venable was graduated from Hampden Sidney College and, in 1783, from Princeton, New Jersey. He practiced law in Charlotte, Prince Edward, Cumberland and Buckingham counties and settled in Charlotte in 1791. He was commonwealth attorney for Charlotte and Prince Edward until 1810 when he moved to Shelby county, Kentucky, where he was elected judge of one of the courts.

He was trustee of Hampden Sidney College 1792 to 1812. During the latter part of the Revolutionary War he served as aide to General Lawson and carried dispatches to La Fayette. Shortly after his removal to Shelby County, Kentucky, he was installed ruling elder in the Mulberry Presbyterian Church. He was a man of much learning, great moral worth and a pure Christian character. His wife died in April, 1832, at their home in Kentucky. He died the following year while on a visit to relatives in Virginia, and was buried at Poplar Hill in Prince Edward county."

Henry E. Watkins lived at what is popularly known as the "Watkins' Place" Prince Edward Co., VA

Henry E. Watkins, father of Francis N., said there was a tradition in the family, "that two brothers came from Wales, and one settled near Richmond, and the other on the Rappahanock;" and that M. David Watkins, of Maryland, often visited his father (who was Francis) and called him cousin, and very much resembled him, but they could not trace relationship to a certainty. But that several families of Powhatan, Appomatox, Pittsylvania and elsewhere in Virginia, were also supposed to be related. "There were also many of the name in Goochland."

Prince Edward county was taken from Amelia in 1753. Amelia county was taken from Prince George in 1734. Prince George was taken from Charles City in 1702.

Tradition is that two brothers came to James City county, in the early settlement of Virginia. One family seated in the Northern Neck (and we have no record of his descendants), and the other brother remained in the Peninsula, between York and James rivers, and was progenitor of the following line. His widow, two daughters and at least one son survived him. He was scalped by the Indians, but the time and manner of his death (if by war, or massacre) is lost, and unfortunately, also his baptismal name.

Dr. Joseph Morton Venable, a physician, was born December 23, 1791, in Charlotte county, VA. He went with the family in 1810 to Shelby county, Kentucky. He was married to Mary F. Cowan, daughter of John C. Cowan of Mercer county, Kentucky in 1817. He died in 1838. They had 8 children; the eldest, Joseph, married Adelia Moore Cochran. They were the parents of

Sarah Frances Venable. Joseph's widow Mary is found living next to her son Joseph in MO in the 1850 Census and she was photographed in Memphis, TN where the family moved. She died there.
