In her 1934 book "The McClures", Mrs. Mabel B. McClure wrote, on page 29 (and included in the notes of Robert (Bob) McClure:

JOHN EWING McCLURE, 1790-1835, was born in the vicinity of Baltimore, Maryland, three months after his parents arrived in this country from Ireland. Shortly after his birth, his parents moved to Lynchburg, VA, where they lived until John grew to manhood." Nancy and Mary were supposedly born in Lynchburg, VA.

The story of John Ewing McClure as given by Mabel Boyd McClure is the following:

"John Ewing McClure (1790-1835) was born in the vicinity of Baltimore, Maryland, three months after his parents arrived in this country from Ireland. Shortly after his birth, his parents moved to Lynchburg, Va., where they lived until John grew to manhood. In 1811, John married Margaret Ann Kennedy and located in Greeneville, Tennessee, where he took charge of the Iron works of his father-in-law, Daniel Kennedy. After a few years, he moved to Rhea County, Tennessee, and settled on a farm which he cultivated for many years. In 1835, he sold this farm, planning to move to Barry County, Missouri. He went down the Tennessee River and the Mississippi, to Louisburg, Arkansas, where his family and party were stricken with cholera. He died there, age 45.

"His wife, Margaret K. McClure, completed the journed to Barry County, Missouri, and with the help of the older sons, she made a comfortable home for her children and educated them. She was a woman of unusual business ability.

"Margaret Kennedy was born in Greene County, Tenn., in 1793. She died in Barry County, Mo., Dec. 1854, at the home of her son, John. She is buried in the cemetery at Washburn, Mo.

"Margaret Kennedy's father, Daniel Kennedy, was killed at the Iron works which he owned, a hammer falling on him and crushing him. The Kennedy Iron works were located on the banks of the Chuckey River, in Greene Co, Tennessee. Daniel Kennedy was born in 1744 in North Carolina; died 1802 in Tenn.; He married Margaret Hughes (1752-1800).

(RMM Note -- this is somewhat strange. John Ewing would have been only years old when Daniel died, and 10 when Daniel's wife died, yet he is supposed to have operated the Iron works after he married Margaret in 1911.

John Ewing McClure and Margaret Ann Kennedy were the parents of 13 children, only nine of whom survived. Their names come from information from M. B. McClure, not verified.

JOHN McCLURE was born near Baltimore, MD in 1790, just three months after his parents arrived from Ireland. Shortly after his birth his father removed to Virginia, locating near Lynchburg. Soon after he removed to Washington County, Tenn., and settled on a farm, where John McClure grew to manhood. The latter was married in 1811, and located in Greenville, taking charge of the iron works belonging to the estate of his father-in-law, Daniel Kennedy. After a few years he removed to Rhea County, and settled on a farm, which he cultivated for a number of years. In 1835 he sold his property in Rhea County, and started for Barry County, MO, but while on his way died in Louisburgh, Ark., of cholera.

Note: There was a "Ewing G. McClure" in the 1900 CENSUS, Civil District 5, Washington, Tennessee, born about 1841 in TN. He stated that his father was born "at sea" and his mother in TN.

Tennessee the Volunteer State 1769-1923: Volume 1 - WAYNE COUNTY: The county officers elected were: Wm. Barnett, County Court clerk; Benj. Hardin, sheriff; Jno. M. Barnett, Circuit Court clerk; JOHN McCLURE, register; Jno. Meredith, trustee; John Hill, ranger; and W. B. Payne, coroner. Courts were held at this place until 1823, when the county seat was moved to Waynesboro, which was founded by Wm. Burns, in 1821, and was sold by him to the commissioners appointed to locate the county seat, viz.: Nathan Biffer, Chas. Burns, Jas. Hollis and John Hill. This land, 40 acres, was divided into lots, which were sold and proceeds used to erect a courthouse. The first Chancery Court was held at Waynesboro in 1847, Judge Terry H. Cahal presiding; C. B. McLean, clerk and master.

John married **Margaret Ann KENNEDY**¹, daughter of Daniel KENNEDY and Margaret HUGHES, on 21 Nov 1811 in Greenville, TN. Margaret was born 1793 in Greene County, Tenn.. She died 1864 in Barry Co, Missouri and was buried in Washburn Prairie Cemetery - Barry Co, Missouri.

Elizabeth came with her father from Alabama, then married Ewing McClure. He was postmaster in Cane Hill in 1845, and he and White (his brother-in-law) opened the second store in Cane Hill. Cane Hill, Washington Co., AR.

Taken from "The McClellans and Allied Families", by Bobbie Jones McLane: "An interesting old

graveyard, just south of Cane Hill, is one of the county's more romantic cemeteries. It is the last resting place of a number of persons who were born in the 18th century, most of them emtombed in massive vaults. It is enclosed by an ornamental iron fence, and contains the dust of veterans of the Mexican War and the War between the States. It is the last resting place of pioneer preachers and school teachers."

Buried in the McClellan Cemetery are: The patriarch of the McClellan clan, John McClellan (1768-1842). He and wife Mary (1774-1856) are buried under fine old vaults, with engraved endstones. The cemetery is no longer owned by the McClellan descendants.

In addition to the rearing of her own children she received into her home and took the place of a mother to the children of

her step-daughter, Mrs. Salmon, following her death and was a mother during the past fifteen years to the children of her daughter, Alice, since her death n 1904.

She professed faith in her Lord at an early age and united with the M. E. Church South of which she remained a consistent and faithful member until death. She was a friend to everybody, loved and honored by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance and great will be her reward by her loving heavenly father for her long years of service in His name and for the welfare an happiness of others.

Death is as profound a mystery today as at the dawn of time. The intervening centuries have witnessed countless efforts to discover the land beyond the mortal sphere, but there is no discoverer of the grave! The achievements of science, and the researchers of philosophy, are powerless alike to solve the enigma of dissolution. With all the advancement of the vaunted present we are as ignorant of our condition beyond the sepulcher, as the savage of pre-historic age.

Yet we have the glorified promise of a beautiful future, if we carry out and live up to the Divine truths that are so plainly portrayed in the Holy Bible, the book of books. The promise of eternal salvation is promised us, if we but obey the Divine injunctions, as Mrs. America L. McClure did during nearly all her entire life on earth, and we will have the blessed assurance of our living in that mansion not prepared by hands, eternal in the skies.

The subject of this sketch, Miss America L. Roland, was born in Franklin county, Tenn., Nov. 17, 1833, and died March 5, 1915, at her home, of la grippe, 5 miles south-west of Cassville, aged 81 years, 2 months and 19 days. She came to Barry county, Mo., at a very tender age with her parents and grandparents, who located at or near Washburn, where she passed her early childhood, early girl and womanhood days. Her father having died when she was about grown, her mother moved to Pea Ridge, Benton county, Ark., where she continued to reside until her marriage to This. J. McClure in October 1866, when she returned to Barry county with her husband, and lived and died on the same farm.

Funeral services were held Thursday afternoon for Roy C. Irvine, 71, who died Monday after spending the last 24 years of his life in Ritzville as publisher of the Ritzville Journal-Times, owner and manager of the Ritz Theater and civic leader. Even during the hard and heart-breaking depression years," Judge Richard B. Ott told a chamber of commerce meeting Wednesday, "Roy Irvine never lost faith in the future of this community. He was one of the most outstanding civic leaders Ritzville ever had." Irvine published the Journal-Times from 1928 to 1937, when he retired from the newspaper business to operate the Ritz Theater. Most local business firms closed from 2 to 3 p.m. Thursday while funeral services were being conducted at Danekas and Duncan funeral home chapel with Edward G. Cross serving as lay reader. Scheduled to act as pall bearers were Judge Ott, Rich Kembel, Rex Phillips, Fred Slipper, Bob Stanfield, Paul Davis, H. W. Ohland, Carl Spliid, George Gearhart and Martin Meyer. Irvine was stricken with a heart attack shortly after being taken to Adams County Memorial hospital by the Danekas and Duncan funeral home ambulance.

A native of Independence, Ore., where he was born Oct. 29, 1880, Irvine published the Lacrosse Clipper for about 12 years before purchasing the Journal-Times from Charles A. Sprague in January of 1928. Irvine published his first issue of the Ritzville newspaper on March 1, 1928. "We shall always do our utmost to further the welfare of our new hometown, and the surrounding country," Irvine pledged in his opening editorial. "The fact that we searched for eight months for a new newspaper and traveled hundreds of miles in that search only to purchase the Journal-Times within one week after we heard it was for sale, is evidence enough of our faith in Adams County." Roy Irvine never lost that faith, Judge Ott said at the chamber of commerce meeting, even though he had taken over the Journal-Times on the eve of the thriving 1920s only to have the nation plunge into depression less than 18 months later.

Irvine with his wife, DAISY, usually operating the typesetting machine, published the Journal-Times for about nine years, until 1937, when he sold the paper to Bill Wilmot, then a young University of Washington graduate, to take over fulltime operation of the Ritz Theater which he had acquired 18 months before. Not long after Irvine constructed the present day Ritz, then and still one of the finest show places in the Big Bend. An active civic leader, Irvine was president of the Ritzville Chamber of Commerce in 1934.

IRVINE is survived at the home by his widow, DAISY, and by two grand nieces, who have living with the Irvines, JOANNE and JOYCE SHOEMAKER. He is also survived by a sister-in-law, Mrs. GRACE SHOEMAKER of Clarkston, two nieces, Bernice Schalock of Edwall and Norma Snead of Seattle; and five nephews, ORNO and VINCENT SHOEMAKER, both of Clarkston; LOREN SHOEMAKER, serving with the armed forces in Germany; Don Haines of Chewlah; and Harold Haines of Inchelium. WALTER TENNAT McCLURE was born in Washburn, MO, December 9, 1856. His parents were William and Paulina Tennant McClure. He graduated with an A.B. degree from Cane Hill College, Boonsboro, Ark., in 1876, and in 1878 the same institution conferred upon him the degree of master of arts. He took a correspondence course from the Univ. of Chicago, 1894-1898, in Hebrew and Arabic, and received a certificate of graduation. In June 1912 he received the D.D. degree from Central College. At 17 years of age Brother McClure was licensed to preach and in 1879 he was ordained a local deacon. For a time he taught Latin and Greek in the Neosho Collegiate Institute, and in 1882 he was admitted on trial in the Southwest Missouri Conference. In 1883 he was ordained an elder at the Conference presided over by Bishop A.W. Wilson in Boonsville.

He married Miss Ophelia Abernathy of Cassville, MO in 1878. She passed away in January 1887, and in October 1888, he was married to Miss Dora Cottey.

[The charges served by Dr. McClure are listed, including Nevada, Lexington, Jefferson City, Kansas City, Independence, Boonville District, St. Paul, Springfield, Centenary, Nevada, Westport, Sedalia 1917-1921, Lexington, Oak Grove, Blue Spring 1929-1932. (dates given)] Dr. McClure was a member of the Board of Curators of Cottey College from its organization until his death, September 17, 1932. For a number of years he was a member of the General Epworth League Board (etc). He was the author of a book "The Betrayed Trust" written primarily for Epworth Leaguers. Dr. McClure served his conference as chairman of its Board of Missions and its Board of Finance, and was for a time a member of the General Board of Missions. We laid his body to rest in the old MacPelah Cemetery in Lexington. The committal service was read at the grave by Dr. Z.M. Williams. Funeral Services For Veteran Cassville Physician Held Sunday In the passing of Dr. S.W. Chandler, Cassville and Barry county have lost their oldest practicing physician and one of their leading citizens. For more than fifty-five years he had faithfully ministered to the sick of this section of Barry county. As was announced in last week's REPUBLCIAN. Dr. Chandler passed away Thursday. Feb. 8, at a Springfield Hospital where he had been for treatment for nearly four weeks. Death was due to heart attacks.

Impressive funeral services were held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon, Feb. 11, at the Koon Funeral Home in Cassville. The services were conducted by Rev. J. A. Burris, Pastor of the Methodist church in Cassville of which Dr. Chandler had been a member for more that forty years. Rev. Burris was assisted by Rev. C. F. Siler, Pastor of the Baptist church and Rev. H. V. Leslie, pastor of the Christian church. A quartet composed of J. L. Riddick, Chas Willis, Truman Thompson and Raymond King; and Mrs. R. G. Brooks, soloist; with Mrs. Troy Wilson at the Piano, furnished music. The flower were profused and lovely. An immense crowd of sorrowing friends from all over the county attended the services. Burial was on the family lot in the Washburn Prairie cemetery, with W. D. Koon undertakers in charge. At the grave the Masonic burial services were given by Pythagoras Lodge No. 383 A. F. & A. M. Masons from the Masonic lodges at Washburn, Wheaton, Purdy, and Monett attended.

Samuel Wilson Chandler was born in Vandalia, Ill., July 14, 1858. He was a son of William Britton and Martha Jane Chandler. He was the last of his father's family to pass away. When a young man he came to Pierce City where he taught school and began the reading of medicine in the office of Dr. Hansard, a pioneer physician of that community. Later he attended and in 1884 was graduated from the Rush Medical college in Chicago and was granted his certificate from the practice of Medicine in this State. He located at Washburn. He was united in marriage to Miss Rebecca McClure in 1885. He continued the practice of his profession at Washburn until he located in Cassville in 1898. After practicing here for a number of years he moved to San Antonio, Tex., and engaged in the practice there for a while, but soon returned to his old home county and had continued in the active practice of his profession until his last illness, a short time before the Christmas holiday, when he suffered a heart attack.

Dr. Chandler had long been recognized as one of the leaders in the medical profession in this section. He had served as President of the Barry County Medical Society and as president of the Southwest Missouri Medical Society. A public spirited citizen he always found time to devote to community and public affairs. He was always found on the right side of any question which concerned the best welfare of his community. For nearly a half century he was one of the pillars of the Methodist church, having served for years as a member of the church board and also as a trustee. For nearly fifty years he had been a loyal member of the Masonic fraternity, forty-two years of that time he was a member of Pythagoras Lodge No. 383, A. F. & A. M. at Cassville. He was also widely known in business circles. He had been for many years the active vice-president and a heavy stock-holder of the First National Bank in Cassville.

Mrs. Chandler passed away in 1926. He was united in marriage five years later to Miss Eva Webb, of Washburn. Surviving of his immediate family are his wife, Mrs. Eva Chandler, a son Charles C. Chandler, President of the First National Bank in Cassville; Mrs. Lois Griffin, wife of George Griffin, who for the past several years had lived in Portland, Ore.; being children of the first marriage; three grand-children, Charles C. Chandler Jr.; Mrs. Frances Shaffer, now in California; and Chandler Griffin; also one great grand-son Charles Chandler the III.

For many years Dr. Chandler had been one of the most faithful members of the Cassville Commercial Club. He attended the meetings of the club regularly and took a keen interest in the work of the club. Only a short time ago the club voted to him a life membership in the club and adopted a resolution which was a beautiful tribute to his life and character. His going is a distinct loss to this community and to the county at large which he had served so long as so well.

DR. WILLIAM LIONEL McCLURE (M.D.) was the genius of the family - a scholar of distinction and renown. Valedictorian of his high school class at Lawton, Okla.; honor man at Drury College, where he took his A.B; ranking first at the University of Illinois who granted him an A.M. in chemistry; winning his 'Medinac Doctdoris' with a magna cum laude from Harvard Medical School in 1923, he proved the degree of his intelligence, winning the highest honors conferred by these institutions. And again, in the examinations required in Massachusetts of those who practice medicine in that state, he was pre-eminent in scholarship, ranking first. After his graduation from Harvard, Dr. McClure was an intern in the Massachusetts General Hospital for two years; then appointed a House Surgeon for two more years. After completing these our years of preparatory work, Dr. McClure became an assistant to Dr. Daniel Fiske Jones, surgeon of Boston, and a partner of Dr. Leland McKittrick with offices on Beacon Street. Dr. McClure was an inventor of surgical instruments and collaborated with Dr. Jones in writing a book on surgery. During the World War he served with the Sanitary Corp of the U.S.A. in the South during the year 1918-1919.

Dr. McClure, son of John Charles and Rosa Adcock McClure, was born in Washburn, MO, August 3, 1893. He was killed in an automobile accident in Cambridge, Massachusetts, March 10, 1930, while on his way to perform an emergency operation in the Cambridge Hospital. A few hours after the accident, he died in Phillips House, without regaining consciousness. His death was a tragedy for which there seems to be no consolation to those who mourn his loss.

Dr. McClure was survived by his parents; two sisters, Mrs. F.E. Weller, Lawton, Okla.; and Mrs. Henry Demuth, Philippine Islands, and a brother, Charles, a medical student in the Univ. of Oklahoma.

The following tributes to Dr. McClure, published at the time of his tragic death, were richly deserved and are here reprinted as an important chapter in the McClure Family History. To one who added glory to the name of McClure and laurels to the family honor, to one so beloved and so regretted, the fitting tribute has not been written. The pride of our family; the joy of our life; we honor you in the preservation of these tributes:

TRIBUTE PAID TO DR. McCLURE, WHO DIED LATELY: Many Springfieldians and Drury folks of the class of '16 will appreciate the unusual tribute to a young Drury man which appeared in the Boston Transcript a few days ago. It is a memorial to Dr. William Lionel McClure, who

lately died, by the head of the teaching staff of the Massachusetts General hospital, Dr. Edward P. Richardson. Dr. McClure was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J.C. McClure of Lawton, Okla., and a nephew of Mrs. J.W. Paynter and a cousin of Mrs. J.W. Bates, both of Springfield. He was an honor graduate of Drury college in 1916. Dr. Richardson write:

"The more closely one is associated with medical school and hospital, the more clearly one appreciates the stages of a surgical career, which otherwise are in part not seen, or telescoped together and blurred as a memory of personal experience. In Dr. McClure one can remember the keen student, the competent interne in the wards of the hospital, the resident surgeon more than adequate in increasing responsibilities, and finally the junior member of the staff fit to deal with greater tasks than can be assigned under hospital routine. Or he can be looked upon from the viewpoint of selection and elimination; a graduate receiving a degree with the highest honors in the power of the Harvard Medical School, the interne chosen at the head of the list and the one picked from among the interns for two further years of resident training. As a back-ground there are the infinite number of decisions increasing in complexity, the hours of assisting day after day for months and years, until reaction to the unexpected becomes almost automatic and finally the increasing sureness as surgeon alone responsible. We see a man simple and direct, keenly interested and intellectually honest, for whom his colleagues felt something deeper than affection. His loss the Massachusetts General Hospital shares with the community - how wide in this instance no one can say. We know that a young eagle, fully plumed, has gone. E.P.R."

HISTORICAL SOCIETY RECEIVES McCLURE ARTICLES, ARTIFACTS: The Comanche County Historical Society this week was presented the "McCLURE ACCESSION" including whittled articles, papers and letters, clothing, and other items of historical value. The presentation was made by MRS. MIRA WELLER, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J.C. McClure, long time residents of Lawton. Highlighting the gifts are hand-whittled stage coaches, miniature replicas hewn in scale; Indian beaded bags, Moccasins, and a cane, and replicas of buildings located on the McClure clan's southwest Missouri homestead.

The McClure family left the home place for Harrison, Ark., and later came to Lawton in 1909. McClure was associated with the Painter-McVicker Wholesale Company, Security National Bank, and the Home Savings and Loan Association.

Mrs. Weller came across the historical items while closing the family home after her parents' death in March 1955. She selected a group of items to be given to the society and another group to keep, which someday too will become property of the society. In accepting the accession, Miss Lily Stafford, Miss Lily Stafford, chairman of the society's museum committee, expressed a desire for others to follow Mrs. Weller's example. "Mrs. Weller is to be commended for bequeathing the sentimental items to the society," she said.

The "McClure Accession" was given to the society through the cooperation of Mrs. HENRY DEMUTH of Oregon, Mrs. Weller's sister. Their brothers, Dr. Lyle (sic) McClure and Dr. William McClure, died in 1930 and 1953 respectively. In explaining how the wooden objects were whittled, Mrs. Weller said: "my father's skill was demonstrated by the fact that out of 12 blocks of wood from which wheels were being carved, only one was ruined." Arthur Lawrence heads the historical group which includes approximately 200 persons holding life, sustaining and annual membership.

Dr. G. W. McClure died at his home in Springfield Monday evening about 6 o'clock after a lingering illness of many weeks. Diseases of the lungs are the causes of his death. His illness was due to pleurisy and later tuberculosis developed. The deceased had several operations performed but all the treatment was of no avail.

Dr. White McClure was a son of the late William McClure and was born on a farm, one mile north of Washburn, about

37 years ago. There he grew to manhood. Being ambitious from childhood to enjoy the advantages of a professional occupation, after attending school at Washburn he entered the Rush Medical College at Chicago, Ill., from which he graduated in 1900. Soon after completing his medical course he began the practice of his profession at Carterville and became recognized as one of the most prominent Jasper County's physicians. Last October he moved to Springfield with the expectation of taking charge of a hospital. Within a few days after his arrival he became ill, and grew worse continually. OLD TIME BARRY COUNTY CITIZEN PASSES

Another old time citizen has been called hence, the angel of death summoning him to come and directed his spirit to the land of abode, where it is hoped he may enjoy sweet rest for he has suffered so long in this life.

Emmett McClure died Tuesday evening, Sept. 8, 1925, at the old McClure home, 4 1/2 miles southwest out on state highway, near where he was born, of tuberculosis, aged 61 years. His daughter Mrs Wear Lee and husband and relatives had tenderly nursed him, as well as his neighbors, who had contributed much toward attempting to comfort him, but without avail. He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thos. J. McClure old and respected citizens of this county.

Many years ago, he married a Miss Abernathy, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bud Abernathy, former residents of Exeter and Rocky Comfort and later at Dublin Texas. The husband was a brother of late M.L. Miles and Milton Abernathy former well known citizens of Barry county. To this union one daughter was born, Miss Nora McClure, who later married Wear Lee, who lived with and cared for him during his sickness. He left a brother and sister to mourn his passing, who are John McClure, Frisco agent at Purdy, and Mrs. Coll Arnold residing near the McClure home.

Emmett McClure for several years had been in the employ of the Frisco Railroad, as supply man at stations where the agent wanted a lay off or they were short of help.

He spent much time in attempting to restore his health, but it had obtained too great a hold on his system. We do not know whether he was a member of any church or not, but he was a believer in the Presbyterian Church.

Rev. E.W. Love of Bethany Presbyterian Church of Joplin, conducted funeral services at his late home and the remains were conveyed to Rocky Comfort Cemetery Thursday where they were intered beside his wife.

Died at his home 4 7/8 miles out on Washburn road, Feb. 13, 1915, Colmore S. Arnold aged 38 years, 2 months and 23 days, of pneumonia and heart trouble. He was born near Washburn and grew to manhood in the neighborhood where he died. He was born Nov. 21, 1876.

In the death of Coll Arnold we fully realize the loss to his family, the neighborhood and county. He was a true friend, and his devotion to those he loved would make a bright chapter in any life. Nothing but the thought of the loving hand that has removed him can reconcile his relatives and many friends to his absence. While he has gone from the scenes, the conflicts, the sorrows and pleasures of this life, he will live in the hearts of those who knew him best.

His retiring nature led him to hide his best qualities from public gaze,

but they were revealed to those who enjoyed his acquaintance, yet it was his home that his true worth was most conspicuous. He was a devoted husband and a loving father and was devoted to the family circle.
